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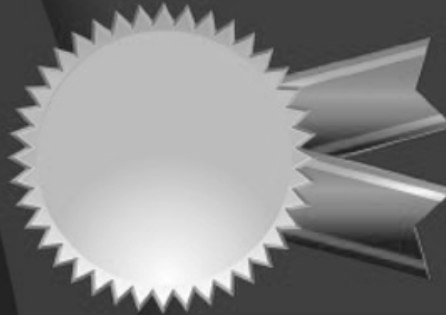
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Editorial Preface

The JBA Journal, this time, is the 19th volume of the 1st issue. As a journal published every four months, we are excited because the number of articles we receive from time to time increases steadily. It is a big challenge to present a variety of manuscripts, mainly when the journal aims to publish high-quality papers. The enthusiasm of the great writers to be published in this journal shows a great need for the presence of the best journals in the field of public administration and related fields as included in the journal's scope.

We realize that the process that is carried out needs to be careful to maintain the journal's quality. Therefore all the flow and mechanisms in publishing manuscripts at JBA must be maintained.

This time we have seven selected manuscripts published. The first paper is entitled Open Government Index in Local Government During the Period of the COVID-19 Pandemic and is written by Tiara Khairunnisa, Achmad Nurmandi, Titin Purwaningsih, Mohammad Jafar Loilatu, and Annisa Ghina Savira. Their paper aims to analysis assessment uses a score of 1-5, and a web assessment with a score of 100. From this calculation, it is found that the five provinces with increased cases have high OGD scores. The results are plotted based on the spread of COVID-19 throughout Indonesia, as determined by reviewing and surveying the provincial government's COVID-19 website.

The second paper is written by Virgiawan Listanto, Nova Yulanda Putri Sipahutar, and Tisa Lestari and is entitled The Emergence of Public Sector Innovation Associated with Civil Servants' Perception in 3T Regions: Results of a Multiple Regression Analysis. They discover that what the civil servants' perception of the emergence of public sector innovations and identifies the factors that influence them. Thirty-nine civil servants of the innovation laboratory WhatsApp group from North Lombok Regency in the 3T regions participated in this study. The data were analysed using descriptive statistics and multiple regression. The result of the study discovered that most civil servants have a positive insight into the emergence of public sector innovations.

The third paper is written by Aqil Teguh Fathani, Novia Amirah Azmi, Eko Priyo Purnomo, Sukanya Aimim Tham, Rohana Ahmad and entitled A Systematic Review of Tourism Governance: Sustainable Tourism Governance Model Post COVID-19. This study aims to examine and categorise themes and concepts related to the study of tourism sustainability governance during the COVID-19 pandemic. The study of tourism governance is becoming a big topic since the emergence of COVID-19, especially from the management point of view, the role and contribution of policy actors, the economy, and changes in social structures. Through qualitative and quantitative analysis with the help of software, VOSviewer and NVivo12+ obtained 78 Scopus-indexed articles relevant to the study.

The fourth paper is entitled Implementation of the Blue Economy Policy in Probolinggo City for the Development of the Creative Economy of Processed Fisheries and Marines and is written by Siti Marwiyah and Nurul Jannah Lailatul Fitria. This study aimed to examine the application of the "Blue Economy" concept in fish processing businesses in Probolinggo City. The research was applied with qualitative methods. Data and information were collected from observations, literature studies, documents, research reports and scientific publications related to the research topic. These documents were analyzed in terms of content (content analysis) and viewed from the social and economic aspects, which were described qualitatively.



The fifth paper is written by Bambang Tri Atmojo, Siswidiyanto and Oscar Radyan Danar, with the paper entitled Penta-helix collaboration in the development of Papua Province's creative economy. The authors see that the problems improving the welfare of the Papuans may be accomplished by implementing the concept of the creative economy, which is indicated by the creative economy's potential for national exports and increased workforce involvement. This demonstrates the possibilities that may be realized by adopting the Penta Helix Collaboration concept. A literature review method with a qualitative approach was used in this research.

Next, the sixth paper entitled Knowledge, Perceptions and Attitudes of Central Government Civil Servants towards the National Capital (IKN) Relocation, written by Renny Savitri, Madya Putra Y. Ahad, Benedicta Retna Cahyarini, Ladiatno Samsara, Hasna Melani Puspasari. This paper describes the condition and correlation of civil servants' knowledge, perceptions and attitudes toward the IKN relocation policy. This research uses quantitative descriptive research methods, which were conducted by distributing surveys to Central Government Civil Servants based in Greater Jakarta. The survey results stated that civil servants had relatively excellent knowledge regarding IKN relocation, while civil servants' perceptions of IKN transfers tended to be negative.

The final paper is written by Akhmad Solikin and Muhammad Afdi Nizar and is entitled Government Revenues and Government Spending Nexus: A Testing Hypothesis for Indonesia. This study aims to test hypotheses related to the direction of the relationship between Indonesian government revenues and expenses. By utilizing quarterly time-series data in the period 1969:q2 – 2020:q4, the test was implemented using the Vector Autoregressive (VAR) model. The implication is that the government budget is always in deficit, and the need for financing (i.e. loans) is unavoidable

All the papers that have been submitted provide essential input, especially in the development of current public policy studies. This issue will serve as a reference for JBA stakeholders. Finally, we would like to thank all members of the editorial team and reviewers for their outstanding dedication.
