This reflects the growing need for reputable journals in the field of public administration and related studies. We are committed to ensuring that every stage of the editorial process upholds academic rigor and makes meaningful contributions to the advancement of public policy and governance.

In this edition, seven carefully selected articles are featured, offering diverse perspectives and empirical findings relevant to current administrative and policy challenges: The first paper examines the air pollution phenomenon in Jakarta, identifying its root causes, primarily motorized vehicle emissions, using a multi-step public policy analysis. The study offers policy recommendations that focus on vehicle control through effective parking management, aiming to mitigate environmental degradation and its impact on public health.

The second paper examines strategic initiatives to enhance Integrity Zones at the Padang Class I Checkpoint Immigration Office, utilizing the Balanced Scorecard (BSC) framework. It highlights the importance of digital infrastructure upgrades, staff development, and an accountability culture in advancing service efficiency and transparency, thereby contributing to theoretical developments in BSC integrity-focused bureaucracies.

The third study focuses on tax compliance among MSME actors in Cianjur Regency, emphasizing the role of tax morale shaped by tax understanding. Findings reveal that comprehensive tax education, transparency, and ethical administration significantly improve compliance, offering practical insights for enhancing Indonesia's tax system in the digital era.

The fourth article explores community governance through the empowerment of ex-convicts who were previously involved in terrorist activities in Cirebon, utilizing social capital theory. The study highlights the significance of microeconomic empowerment, addressing societal stigma, and fostering private sector collaboration to facilitate reintegration and mitigate radicalization risks, while also identifying gaps in local regulations and counter-terrorism initiatives.

The fifth article presents a systematic review of the Public Service Motivation (PSM) literature, conducted in accordance with the PRISMA protocol. It categorizes 210 studies and proposes a future research agenda that emphasizes multidisciplinary approaches and rigorous methodologies to understand better the role of PSM in improving public service effectiveness globally and in Indonesia.

The sixth paper proposes COVI Sronдол, an innovative monitoring and evaluation (M&E) strategy for post-competency development (post-comdev) to accelerate Central Java Corporate University (Jateng Corpu). Using a mixed-methods approach, the study identifies significant gaps in existing monitoring and evaluation (M&E) practices and proposes a comprehensive framework that integrates digital solutions for sustainable capacity building in the health sector.
